From The Life of St. Clare, by Celano.

A Perugine named Buongiovanni of Martino joined his fellow citizens in their war against the town of Foligno in 1254. Some heavy skirmishes were fought here and there and a blow from a stone gave him a serious fracture on his hand. In his desire to be healed, he spent a large amount of money on doctors, but no medical treatment could restore the use of his hand, which was completely powerless to do any kind of work.

Thus, he was so upset about being forced to suffer the burden of that right hand, over which he essentially had no control, and about being deprived of its use, that he often thought it would be better to have it amputated.

Then, after hearing what the Lord had deigned to demonstrate to him through his servant Clare, he made a vow and went to the virgin's sepulcher. He offered her a wax hand and lay down in front of the tomb of St. Clare. Before he could even leave the church, his hand was immediately healed.
