Dearest sisters and brothers of Penance in the Little Flower Fraternity OFS,

Our Secular Franciscan Order is a special canonical organization within the Roman Catholic Church and the Franciscan Order. We are not a social club or a parish ministry.

The OFS was created under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit by Saint Francis of Assisi as he answered the cries of Blessed Lucheso and Bella Donna, his wife, to provide a way for lay persons to live the Franciscan charism in their everyday lives.

The roots of our branch of Franciscanism then were planted in Heaven from our very beginning within the heart of Francis and the Franciscan order. This is why we Seculars take our profession into the Order so seriously. This is why candidates spend as long as three years in formation before their profession. And at profession the candidates pledge to follow Jesus in the spirit of Saint Francis for the rest of their lives.

Profession is one of the most serious commitments we make in our lives. We make it prayerfully and with full consent of the will. From the moment of profession we are marked by a special charism as a member of the third order following in the footsteps of our Seraphic Father, Saint Francis of Assisi. With humility we now add the letters O.F.S. after our names for the rest of our lives, and profess to live the Gospel life from Gospel to life and from life to Gospel in obedience to the Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.

Brothers and sisters, let us always remember our fraternal life as Secular Franciscans is integral to our formation and growth in our Franciscan vocation and our relationship with Jesus, Our Lord and Savior. It is so serious in nature that it has been inscribed into our rule as a requirement and a sign of our commitment to walking the Franciscan Way.

Mark your calendars for the second Saturday of every month (except this April 8, 2023 when it falls on Holy Saturday, causing us to meet on April 15) when we gather to share our love for the Lord and each other at St. Francis of Assisi Church in Burke Hall. Holy Mass at 900am is optional but highly encouraged, the social gathering begins at 930am and the formal gathering begins at 10am and ends at noon.

I ask that we all, in the final days of Lent 2023, prayerfully encounter the Lord Jesus at the center of our Franciscan vocational call and renew in Him the promises we made to Him on the day of our profession.

As we continue our journey with Jesus, Mary, the Apostles, and the Disciples to Jerusalem may the Lord bless us during these final days of Lent, in Holy Week, and in the glory of Our Blessed Lord's Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

A Message from our Treasurer:

I wish to address **two** very important items with you.

First, we have now come to that time of year when each of us is to submit our Fair Share to our treasury. If you have already submitted yours for 2023, a profound "thank you" is in order. This year's Fair Share is remaining the same at \$40 for the year. Your contribution is due to the Little Flower Treasury by the end of April. Please make sure to mark your payment as "FAIR SHARE". These funds are submitted to the region in totality. None of the Fair Share collection remains with the Little Flower Fraternity. Your contribution is sent to the Regional Treasurer where some remains for the region and the balance is sent to the National Council. After the National Council holds their share, the balance is sent to the International Council. These funds help the Order on a much larger scale to help maintain, grow and hold to the steadfast tenets of our Secular Franciscan lives. If you are unsure if you have submitted your contribution for 2023 or are having difficulty with this contribution, please reach out to the Council.

Second, the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Our Lord is the foundation on which our faith was built. As we journey with Jesus in these coming days remember to take the time to pray and reflect on Scripture and contemplate the events that brought Him to Calvary. But, go deeper. As sinners, followers and penitents it is our duty to evaluate our own personal journey and to look at the ways in which we have failed, faltered and what we have done to make things right. While we do not want to be boastful about how we have repented, it is acceptable to self-acknowledge the ways we were of service to God as a means to "keep things in check." Just remember that we do not have to wait until Lent/Easter to do all of this. This is something that must be on-going as Secular Franciscans. This is not a "one and done" type thing.

Self-evaluation of our lives, challenges, responsibilities, commitments (etc. etc.) is necessary to lead a balanced life. All of these can start to snowball and before we know it we have committed to way too many things. (Admit it...we have all done this!) This over commitment can start to take its toll on our physical, mental and spiritual well-being. In recent months my commitments have changed. I find I need to make some changes in order to stay physically and mentally healthy and to allow my spirituality to not be overwhelmed by all the other responsibilities life has been throwing at me. The daunting decision had to be made. Something had to give. After considerable prayer and discernment, I have submitted my request to the Little Flower Fraternity Council to take a sabbatical starting May 1, 2023 with a re-evaluation in December 2023.
