- 2. How do you serve in your parish? How would you like to serve with your gifts in our fraternity?
- 3. What suggestions do you have for Area Group activities? i.e., skits, saints, testimonies? monthly breakfast foods?
- 4. What changes would you like to see in meeting time, prayer, apostolates, food, etc.?

However, don't feel yourself bound by these four questions. Write any ideas you have on the paper provided during the meeting.

So please spend some time praying on this prior to the meeting. Consider:

- Meditating on our Rule and identify which Franciscan values our Fraternity needs to improve upon and how we might put that into action.
- Reading the following article reprinted from the regional Up-to-Now Newsletter, 2023 August

NATIONAL SECULAR FRANCISCAN THEME: LISTEN, DISCERN AND GO FORTH

During a conference in early May, National JPIC Animator Carolyn Townes led discussions on the theme adopted by the National Council: **LISTEN**, **DISCERN AND GO FORTH**. Regional JPIC Animator Gil Donahue participated in this process. It is important to consider the themes, relate them to our mission as Secular Franciscans, and consider how we might be more intentional in carrying them out.

LISTEN

Secular Franciscans are meant to be bearers of peace and perfect joy and act as salt and light in our communities. We are New Testament Christians, and particularly called to live The Beatitudes, engage in good works and give glory to God. Listening is essential to this process.

We need to ask ourselves, and fraternity members, these particular questions:

- What am I/are we being called to be and do?
- How can I/we best carry out the Gospel message in the fraternity, and in my community?
- What is holding me/us back?

Within our local fraternities, we need to engage in quiet listening. Pre-conditions are: respect each other and be open to the views of others. Listening should be non-judgmental. Ideally, we should set aside our own agenda and the retort "we've always done it this way." This is an opportunity for new thinking.

DISCERN

Discernment is not a straightforward process. It involves listening and responding to the place within us where our deepest yearnings align with God's desires for us. We need to consider what our individual charism is and how best to use it. We should ask ourselves:

- Why did God call me to be a Franciscan?
- Is my fraternity fulfilling its mission?
- Am I as an individual, and are we as a fraternity, making an effort to live a Gospel life?
- What is holding me/us back?

GO FORTH

The going forth process is outwardly oriented. We are expected to carry our Gospel values into the wider community. We have access to people and places unknown to the clergy.

To start, we need to be open to new ideas. We can also show individual and group initiative. A fraternity member might say: "I'm going to do this; would anyone like to join me?" There are various social change roles; some individuals fit better with one than another:

1. Helpers - involving direct service, volunteering in charities

2. **Advocates** - working inside the system, attempting reforms, helping others navigate the system; social workers and attorneys

3. Organizers - planning, directing activities outside/alternative to the system

4. **Rebels** - speaking truth to power (i.e., being prophets); public protest and direct action

The discernment process should guide individual fraternity members to consider which one of these categories they most comfortably fit in. There is no "one size fits all." We should ask ourselves:

- Which roles am I/are we most drawn to?
- Where can I/we make a difference?
- What do I and the fraternity do best?
- What can I/we do more?
- What is holding me/us back?

Finally, in the loving community that our fraternity is expected to be, let us remember: Everyone is a valued brother or sister. We should "Encourage each other every day while it is still today" (Hebrews 3:13).
