Minister’s Minute:

Dear Brothers and Sisters, Happy New Year. May it be a blessed one for you and your family. May God lead you closer to Him and to His mother.

At this time of year we look forward to the fresh start of a New Year and back at the past year---, its joys and struggles, its ups and downs the times we fell short and the times we rose above the trials with God’s help and we rejoice that at all times God was with us.

Your Council has decided that this month we will all do the same thing with the past year of our fraternity life. As we did last year we will ask you to fill out little papers with your answers to the questions on the next page. To help with that process each of the Council members and others will be sharing about a Franciscan value, i.e. , Judith-Prayer, Denise- Adoration/Eucharist-, Joe- JPIC/Justice, Catherine-Service to the Poor, Joan F.-Environment, Ruth-Peace, Jean-Prolife .

We look forward to hearing your suggestions. Our last chapter in When St. Francis Saved the Church is about Francis’ vision and ends with a quote from His Testament. You can read the full text in your Ritual p.76. where it states “We adore you, Lord Jesus Christ in all your churches throughout the world and we bless you for through your holy cross you have redeemed the world. “ This year the Franciscan Centenary focus is on the Stigmata (as it had been on Greccio last year) and Pat has created a prayer card for prayer partners to be distributed at the meeting that highlights the San Damiano Cross. “The Poverello is presented as a person who made listening a way of life: ‘Saint Francis heard the voice of God, he heard the voice of the poor, he heard the voice of the infirm and he heard the voice of nature. He made them a way of life. My desire is that the seed that Saint Francis planted may grow in the hearts of many.” (Fratelli tutti)

One of our Franciscan values is Prolife Our Capuchin Brothers will be celebrating a Mass for Life on Friday January 19th at 11 am in the Crypt Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (see schedule of earlier activities at the Shrine in this Porter). This is a Prayer For Life by Pope St. John Paul II. Let us ask our patroness and advocate to intercede: O Mary bright dawn of the new world, Mother of the living to you do we entrust the cause for life: Look down, O Mother, upon the vast numbers of babies, not allowed to be born, of the poor whose lives are made difficult, of men and women who are victims of brutal violence, of the elderly and the sick killed by indifference or out of misguided mercy. Grant that all who believe in your Son may proclaim the Gospel of life with honesty and love to the people of our time. Obtain for them the grace to accept that Gospel as a gift ever new , the joy of celebrating it with gratitude throughout their lives and the courage to bear witness to it resolutely, in order to build, together with all people of good will, the civilization of truth and love to the praise and glory of God, the Creator and love of life. (Evangelium Vitae)

FIRE AT THE LIGHT HOUSE DISPLACES RESIDENTS

ANNAPOLIS, MD (January 9, 2024) – A one-alarm fire at The Light House on Hudson Street in Annapolis has temporarily displaced more than 70 shelter residents.

According to Annapolis Fire Chief Douglas Remaley, at approximately 5:35 p.m. on Tuesday, January 9, firefighters were dispatched to 10 Hudson Street for a fire alarm. While responding, additional information by the 911 center reported a fire in the building, bringing additional firefighters to the scene.

Firefighters quickly entered and found an extinguished fire in the laundry room on the second floor with no extension. There were no injuries to fire or civilian personnel. Preliminary investigation revealed that the fire started from a malfunctioning light fixture in the laundry room on the second floor of a three-story structure.

A total of 70 people were displaced primarily as a result of water dispersal from the sprinkler system. Residents will return to the building after appropriate repairs and inspection.

The Annapolis Office of Emergency Management helped to coordinate the relocation of shelter residents. Annapolis Recreation and Parks staff are preparing the auxiliary gym for overnight guests at the Roger “Pip” Moyer Recreation Center on Hilltop Lane. Annapolis Transit will transport the shelter residents to the Recreation Center.

“All of us at The Light House would like to express our sincerest gratitude to those who have been assisting us during this time,” said Heather Cassity, Executive Director of The Light House. “This was a tremendous coordinated effort. Everyone came together to help our neighbors in need. The silver lining of coming out of the pandemic is that it has strengthened the ties that we have with our community partners, and together we can respond with an efficient effort when emergencies happen. We are so grateful that everyone is safe and there are many heroes behind the scenes. We’re eager to have our doors reopen as soon as possible and we are making all efforts for limited interruption.”

Some of the residents sought overnight accommodations with family or friends. A total of 44 residents were transported to the Recreation Center where they will stay for at least one overnight while repairs are made. Light House staff have been notified and will continue uninterrupted care for our residents. All Light House support services including meals, case management, and other basic needs will continue to be provided to residents during their stay at Pip Moyer Recreation Center.

At this time, Annapolis Fire reports that damage loss estimates are pending. There were both working smoke alarms and a properly functioning sprinkler system. Responding partner agencies included Anne Arundel County Fire and Naval District Washington Support Activities (NSA) Annapolis.

EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING

*Catherine Gonzalez found this gem in the church bulletin from St. John the Apostle Church in Virginia Beach, VA
Better a little late than not at all.*

There is a custom of blessing homes on the Feast of the Epiphany (January 7) when the family gather to ask God's blessing on their home and family life. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our homes.

Instructions for blessing the home:

Use chalk, preferably blessed, to mark on the door or door frame with the symbols 20 + C + M + B + 24

Pray: Lord God of heaven and earth, you revealed your only-begotten Son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless this house and all who inhabit and visit it. Fill us with the light of Christ, that our concern for others may reflect your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Meaning of the inscription 20 + C + M + B + 24

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi – Caspar, Malchior and Balthazar – who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: “May Christ bless this house.” The + signs represent the cross and the “20” at the beginning and the “24” at the end mark the current year. Taken together, this inscription is performed as a request for Christ to bless those homes so marked and that He stay with those who enter and visit therein throughout the entire year.
