#### MOTHER MARY ELIZABETH LANGE

The canonization cause of Mother Mary Lange, founder of the world's first sustained women's religious community for Black women, has taken a step forward. Baltimore-based Oblate Sisters of Providence received an email on February 27, from the Vatican informing the sisters that it has approved the "*positio*" -- the documentation on the life of Mother Lange, which includes both the theological and historical record of her life.

Mother Lange's *positio* will go to the Dicastery for the Causes of Saints for review. When the review is completed, it will be sent to Pope Francis, and he will declare Mother Mary Lange venerable," she said.



"Venerable" is a declaration of a sainthood candidate's heroic virtues. Next would come beatification, after which she would be called "Blessed." The third step is canonization. In general, the last two steps require a miracle attributed to the intercession of the sainthood candidate and verified by the church.

Mother Lange established St. Frances Academy in Baltimore in 1828 to educate Black children in an era of slavery. She went on to form the Baltimore-based Oblate Sisters of Providence in 1829 as the first woman's religious community for African Americans. the Oblate Sisters taught the children of slaves and former slaves how to read the Bible. They went on to teach in schools, work in parishes, care for the sick and labor in other ministries in the United States, Cuba, Costa Rica, the Dominican Republic, and parts of Africa.

The Vatican is considering the testimony of a woman who says she was cured of a life-threatening condition through the intercession of a 19th century Baltimore nun. Similar testimonies from around the world are making their way to the motherhouse of the Oblate Sisters of Providence in Arbutus, Maryland.

Already filling three volumes, the letters have arrived from Ireland, Cuba, the Philippines, and all over the United States – bolstering hopes that Mother Mary Lange may one day be named a saint.

#### Prayer for the Beatification of the Venerable Pierre Toussaint

Lord God, source of love and compassion, we praise an honor you for the virtuous and charitable life of our brother in Christ Venerable Pierre Toussaint.

Inspired by the example of our Lord Jesus, Pierre worshiped you with love and served your people with generosity. He attended Mass daily and responded to the practical and spiritual needs of friends and strangers, of the rich and the poor, of the sick and the homeless of nineteenth century New York.

If it is your will, let the name of Venerable Pierre Toussaint be officially raised to the rank of saint, so that the world may know this Haitian New Yorker who refused to hate or be selfish but instead lived to the full commandments of heaven and the divine law of love—love for God and for neighbor. By following his example and asking for his prayers, may we, too, be counted among the blessed in heaven. We ask this through Christ Our Lord. Amen

#### Prayer for the Beatification of the Venerable Mother Henriette Delille

O good and gracious God, you called Henriette Delille to give herself in service and in love to the slaves and the sick, to the orphan and the aged, to the forgotten and the despised.

Grant that, inspired by her life, we might be renewed in heart and in mind. If it be your will, may she one day be raised to the honor of sainthood. By her prayers, may we live in harmony and peace, through Jesus Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

## Prayer for the Beatification of the Venerable Father Augustus Tolton

O God, we give you thanks for your servant and priest, Father Augustus Tolton, who labored among us in times of contradiction, times that were both beautiful and paradoxical. His ministry helped lay the foundation for a truly Catholic gathering in faith in our time. We stand in the shadow of his ministry.
