
Let us pray the prayer of St. Francis to Mary.

Chapter 1 The Secular Franciscan Order (OFS)

2. The Secular Franciscan Order holds a special place in this family circle. It is an organic union of all Catholic fraternities scattered throughout the world and open to every group of the faithful. In these fraternities the brothers and sisters, led by the Spirit, strive for perfect charity in their own secular state. By their profession they pledge themselves to live the gospel in the manner of St. Francis by means of this rule approved by the Church

#### Reflection-

"How graced each Secular Franciscan is to have been called to this way of life, to this particular charism, to a local fraternity that is bonded with all other fraternities throughout the world, to live a Rule by profession that has the approval and blessing of Holy Mother Church! Beyond the Secular Franciscan Order, members are joined in this life with the other branches of the Franciscan family, The First Order friars, the Second Order Poor Clares, and the sisters and friars of the Third Order Regular. According to Canon Law, the Secular Franciscan Order is a public association in the Church (GC 1,5) whose secular state characterizes their spirituality and apostolic life (GC 3.1). We are a large family, consisting of hundreds of thousands of followers of St. Francis. Profession is an enormous event in the life of the fraternity as well as in our own lives. Special graces are realized when we, in humility, accept the Rule of St. Francis as our way of life. We are united as brothers and sisters, led by the Holy Spirit, all striving for perfect charity. What a great gift of God this is."

### Saint of the Month

#### Offered by our formation director, Nela Wintjen

#### St. Peter of Alcantara Franciscan Friar of the Stricter Observance (1499-1562)

St. Peter, who was born in Alcantara, a small town in Spain, studied at the great university of Salamanca, and entered the Franciscans at the age of sixteen. From the start, Peter adopted a habit of extreme austerity. He trained himself to sleep no more than two hours a night; he wore no sandals on his feet; he would eat no flesh and drink no wine. Eventually he won permission to found a group of Franciscans along these lines. It was said that their cells – only seven feet long-resembled more graves than rooms. Nevertheless, he found many willing followers.

In the course of extensive preaching tours, he came to know St. Teresa of Avila and became her spiritual advisor. At that time, she was seeking courage to undertake her reform of the Carmelite Order and she later testified on behalf of his canonization that it was Peter, more than anyone, who had encouraged her mission. "When I came to know him he was very old, and his body so shriveled and weak that it seemed to be composed as it were of the roots and dried bark of a tree rather than flesh," she wrote. She also claimed, after his death in 1562, to receive visions of Peter, so that "Our Lord has been pleased to let me enjoy more of him than I did when he was alive."

One time a brother was complaining to Peter about the wickedness of the world, and the saint replied, "The remedy is simple. You and I must first be what we ought to be; then we shall have cured what concerns ourselves. Let each one do the same, and all will be well. The trouble is that we all talk of reforming others without ever reforming ourselves."

St. Peter died on October 18, 1562. He was canonized in 1669.

### The Deepest Identity of the Secular Franciscan
