# January 2023: Article Twenty of the Rule of Life

Article Twenty of the Rule of Life describes the hierarchy of the Secular Franciscan Order. At first glance, this hierarchy might appear to be administrative in nature and overly bureaucratic, but this hierarchy is the link to each Franciscan and fraternity at every level and to the Church. In many ways it reflects and is a part of the four marks of the Church (One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic). Each level of the order are governed by the Rule and the Constitution, which are approved by the Pope. This common governance ensures that all parts of the order, every level are united

The most basic and important part of this hierarchy is the local fraternity. Just as families form the Church; so, the local fraternities form the order. Thus, in many ways the fraternities assume the characteristics of the family. The Regional and National levels of fraternity provide guidance and unity between the local fraternities. As all are united in their common beliefs, the Rule, and the Constitution, each element down to the individual Secular Franciscan becomes brothers and sisters. At every level, the OFS is united to the First Order and the Third Order Regular which helps us remain focused on our common Franciscan characteristics and spirituality. In many ways, this hierarchy resembles the hierarchy of the Church. At the National and International levels, all Franciscans become united to each other and the Church with guidance and interaction with the Pope.
