

RECAP OF FEBRUARY 4 GATHERING

PRESENTATION

Gil Donahue, OFS, spoke on the handout he provided, "Franciscans: Stewards of Life Unto Death: Preparing for a Good Franciscan Death":

Key Franciscan spirituality themes:

- Kinship of all creation
- Stewardship of the earth/Integrity of Creation
- · Living a simple life; emphasizing spiritual, not material, values
- Gospel to Life, Life to Gospel
- Righting wrongs; uplifting others/preferential option for the poor

Honesty for ourselves and prudent planning for the future:

- Conceit we will live forever
- Failure to be honest with ourselves
- Denial of death
- Failure to prepare and plan
- Importance of a Will or Living Trust, Power of Attorney, other preparations
- Express final wishes to the parish & fraternity
- Virginia Advance Medical Directive form (Inova has its own version)

The book, *Through Death to Life: Preparing to Celebrate the Funeral Mass* by Joseph M. Champlin is used by St. Joseph Catholic Church. There is a copy available in the Tau library collection.

Pam Brooks, OFS, discussed end-of-life legal issues that became a national topic of focus with the 1975 case of Karen Ann Quinlan. Other highlights included:

- Durable Power of Attorney valid after the person is incompetent/unable to make decisions
- Prepare a Living Trust to avoid probate costs and a Will
- Holographic (handwritten) Wills are valid in Virginia
- Funeral Home pre-pay makes the arrangements binding

Gil encouraged us to talk with our families and leave instructions for our survivors — including social media, as it's considered intellectual property. Gil also provided printed copies of the Wake and Burial Wishes form to be completed and given to family, if interested. It memorializes your wishes regarding a Secular Franciscan burial. Please send a copy to Josh Goldberg, OFS, as well, should you decide to use the form.

Veronica O'Donnell, OFS, shared that the Cool Spring Natural Cemetery at Holy Cross Abbey in Berryville offers burial plots.

ONGOING FORMATION

We watched two videos, A Prayer for Ukraine and When We Don't Know How to Pray (the latter made available soon after the start of the 2023 war between Israel & Hamas).


PRAYER SHAWL APOSTOLATE





CONSECRATION TO ST. JOSEPH

Have you consecrated yourself to St. Joseph?

What does it mean for a person to be consecrated to St. Joseph? Well, it basically means that you acknowledge that he is your spiritual father, and you want to be like him. To show it, you entrust yourself entirely into his paternal care so that he can help you acquire his virtues and become holy. Total consecration to St. Joseph means you make a formal act of filial entrustment to your spiritual father so that he can take care of your spiritual well-being and lead you to God. The person who consecrates himself to St. Joseph wants to be as close to their spiritual father as possible, to the point of resembling him in virtue and holiness. Saint Joseph, in turn, will give those consecrated to him his undivided attention, protection, and guidance.
