

Chapter 2 The Way of Life

7. United by their vocation as "brothers and sisters of penance" and motivated by the dynamic power of the gospel, let them conform their thoughts and deeds to those of Christ by means of that radical interior change which the Gospel itself calls "conversion." Human frailty makes it necessary that this conversion be carried out daily.

On this road to renewal the sacrament of reconciliation is the privileged sign of the Father's mercy and the source of grace.

Reflection-Look at Francis. He wasn't Assisi's great public sinner, but still he had to get off his high horse and kiss the leper in order to achieve a new and decisive breakthrough in his relationship with God. It was no longer enough for him to follow the ordinary and expected religious practices of his day.

The same with us. Conversion isn't just a once-in-alifetime experience or a good idea now and then. It is an ongoing program to critique and better our growth toward the Lord.

We can't be content with a personal spirituality that is so narrow and set in its ways that it hasn't had a facelift in a few years.

We cannot in conscience bemoan changes in the liturgy or discipline of the church, complain about the activities or ideologies of certain groups or classes of people, or blame someone else besides ourselves for shortages or high prices, without first attempting to understand the reasons behind an issue or action, walking in the other side's shoes for a while, and doing our part to improve a situation.

Yes, conversion means turning more closely toward the Lord. By the same token, it also means a greater sensitivity and consciousness for applying the gospel to interpersonal and social situations, to the political and economic issues of the day, and to the very personal questions of prayer and repentance.

When we pledge to "observe the holy gospel," we likewise pledge a "radical interior change" from the deepest recesses of the heart to the farthest outreach of our involvements.
