



Article 17 of our Rule tells us:

"In the family, they should cultivate the Franciscan spirit of peace, fidelity, and respect for life, Striving to make of it a sign of a world already renewed in Christ.

By living the grace of matrimony, husbands and wives in particular should bear witness in the world to the love of Christ for His Church. They should joyfully accompany their children on their human and spiritual journey by providing a simple and open Christian education and being attentive to the vocation of each child."

A third apostolic action of the Gospel message looks into family life. Contrary to the popular standard today especially, the family is still the God-established unit of our human society (and all other forms as well if we consider our Holy Father Francis's idea of creation as our, "Home"). It is but a smaller version of our total world always up for redemption by Christ. Our own Franciscan-based families both are and can be examples of the love and dignity and that of Christ's love for His Church in contrast to the Godless versions of today's "dysfunctional" families we see in our communities. We have long since already known of the special ministry of husband and wife in two major areas: the education of our children and being witnesses for Christ, experiencing Him through our family life. As laity, this sort of apostolic action is perhaps one of the most important measure we take in portraying the mission of the Church.

Minister's January Message

I hope you all have had a very Blessed Christmas.

January seems to be a very good month to reflect that earth is not our eternal home and that it determines where we will spend out eternity and the degree of glory we will enjoy in Heaven. Lets put our shoulders to the plow and do all we can to make sure we and many many others get there safely and with the degree of glory God wishes to bestow upon us. How? The Sacraments, Adoration. Forgiveness, the Rosary, relentless and kind Spiritual and Corporeal Acts of Mercy and loyalty to Church Teaching.

On Facebook I notice that a number of people who self-identify as Franciscans do not support core Church teachings in several critical areas. While one is so heartened to see the liberality of love which marks the beautiful Franciscan soul, it is sad to how this same liberality of love seems to lead souls astray as they reject doctrine which they see as uncharitable. This is an error of our age.

Please believe in the catechism of the Catholic Church in all of its teachings. On her deathbed, Mother Seton admonished her sisters to remain good children of the Church. This can be difficult in our day and age. St. Francis is a wonderful model in this. He was unfailingly loyal to church teaching and also unfailingly courteous and loving even when he realized that the person with whom he was interacting was an unrepentant sinner. St. Francis did not try to walk away from church teaching in a confused understanding of brotherly love. St Francis did not reject sinners just the sins. It is so easy to wish that active homosexual marriage should be permitted in sacramental unions celebrated in the church, that abortion in very difficult circumstances of poverty and incest are ok, or that euthanasia for those gripped in terrible suffering is acceptable, but they are not. In humility let us accept Church Teaching as our unfailing guide.

Prayer: Dear St. Francis, never let us turn our hearts from God because of physical or emotional suffering, that of our own or others. Help us to be loyal children of the Church and always try to help our fellow man achieve his salvation as we work for our own.
