

Sep 17th – Feast of the Stigmata⁴

Two years before the great Saint Francis of Assisi died, and when he was forty-two years old — one year after he had built the first crib in honor of Our Lord — he went off to a lonely mountain called Mount La Verna, to prepare



himself by forty days of fasting and prayer for the feast of Saint Michael, whose feast day is September 29. On the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on September 14, Saint Francis received in his hands, feet and side the Sacred Wounds from Our Lord's own body. Never was a saint more beautifully loved by Jesus than Saint Francis of Assisi. The wounds Jesus gave him stayed in his hands, feet and side, and continually bled for two more years, until he died in 1226. The day on which Saint Francis received the Five Wounds of Our Lord was September 14, but so that this beautiful event might have a feast day for itself, the Stigmata of Saint Francis are commemorated on September 17.

September Reflection

In the recent movie *Overcomer*, one of the main characters is asked, "Who are you?" He responds that he is a basketball coach, a history teacher, a husband, a father. If all these are taken away (and here the fate of Job comes to mind), *then* who are you? He finally says he is a Christian. He is then asked why God was only fifth on the list, and not mentioned first.

Two things come to mind at this point: The "who" as distinct from the "what", the latter being attributes of our lives but not of its essence; and the manner in which the question was asked, as though Jesus was posing a question to his examiners, to get them to think more clearly.

Without giving anything away, I can say the man examines his life in a new way.

This examination, reflection, discernment about one's life – where we are weak, where we have failed, how we can improve – and our resolve to change, to come closer to what God has called us to be – the Church calls conversion. It is something every Christian is called to do. Franciscans, especially, are called to daily conversion, to take up our cross – whatever it may be that day – each day and follow our Lord. That we Secular Franciscan are called to do so in a special way is made clear by our Rule.

In a similar way, we may be asked who we are, on our deepest level. How would we respond? Loving mother or father? Faithful employee? Reflecting upon this scene in the movie, we hope we would all say a follower of Christ Jesus, imitating him in the manner of our seraphic father, St. Francis, who sought nothing more than to be united to our Lord.
