

# Where is Love?

Can it be found somewhere along the way like some treasure that makes the Journey worthwhile? Or is love the Journey itself? Or is it the Dream that makes the Journey possible? These thoughts ran through Francis' mind one day as he listened to Brother Leo reading to him the Letter of John the Apostle: "God is love, and if you abide in love, you abide in God and God in you."

Yes, if you found God, you also found love. But that was only the beginning of the Quest, for who was ever sure of having found God or even sure of looking for God in the right places and by the right road? Francis' experience in the cave assured him that Jesus dwelled within him, that God was nowhere farther than his own heart. But there were other Presences of God he sought to find. He wanted to search for God in all the places where he dwelled and he knew that such a quest meant finding God everywhere along the way.

That is where love was, that is where God was-anywhere and everywhere.

Having given up home and family, St. Francis embraced Jesus' Great Command to love wholeheartedly. Nothing held him bound. He was free to live his life as he felt called by God to do. He loved those members of his own Order. He loved the townspeople to whom he spoke. He loved the people who jeered him for giving up a comfortable life. Francis forsook all so that he was better able to love God with his whole heart, his whole soul, his whole mind, and his whole strength. In doing so, he was able to love his neighbor as himself, most often, better than himself. Francis found that, for himself, freedom from worldly possessions and cares afforded him the opportunity to love more.

Francis wished the same for those who would hear the same dynamic call of the Gospel. Some did so unencumbered, others not. Secular Franciscans, while living in the world are still called to follow this command to love. Secular Franciscans must set aside those things which do not allow them to remain free to love others. With fullest intention and deepest desire, Secular Franciscans should strive to love God as God deserves to be love. They should see in each person they meet the spirit of God. In greeting another person, they should greet the very spirit of God.

This freedom, this sharing of love, will help all persons realize the good that is yet to come, for the love we share on this earth falls far short of the love God has prepared for us for all eternity.

Where there is poverty with joy,
there is neither greed nor avarice.
Where there is rest and meditation,
