

General Constitutions of the Secular Franciscan Order



The Form of Life Article 17

3. Those who are called to carry out the mission of catechists, presiders of ecclesial communities, or other ministries, as well as the sacred ministers, should make the love of Francis for the word of God their own, as well as his faith in those who announce it, and the great fervor with which he received the mission of preaching penance from the Pope.

St. Francis Turned into Prayer

Prayer was Francis' native tongue. He spoke it with heart, intellect and body. When he prayed...He fastened on the presence of God and did not let go.

St. Francis did not make petition his primary form of prayer. His Rule of 1221 affirms...that priority must be given to praise and thanksgiving. "We should wish for nothing else and have no other desire; we should find no pleasure or delight in anything except our Creator...."

The Poverello (Poor Man) was the personification of St. Paul's advice, "Dedicate yourselves to thankfulness." When he was turned away from shelter in a storm, abused and insulted, given scraps for dinner or a stone for a pillow, he responded with gratitude...because he appreciated the opportunity to experience the bodily sufferings of Christ...

He made of his life a "holy leisure," an openness to God's presence whenever, wherever, however the Spirit came to him. Sometimes he turned to prayer, other times, he turned into prayer. One observer said of him, "He seemed not so much a man praying as prayer itself made man."

For several years, our sister, Geri Flynn, OFS has been busy making sleeping mats out of plastic shopping bags for our homeless sisters and brothers for the Franciscan Center in Baltimore.

Geri tells us, "crocheting or knitting these sleeping mats for those who find themselves homeless has been such a pleasure. In addition to providing a lightweight, waterproof surface between the person and the cold, wet ground, they are also an amazingly positive way to utilize plastic bags!"

"Each mat uses up to 500 bags—so much better than the landfill - I find so many people are happy to save their bags for me. Our kids got a kick out of me quietly **removing** bags from our supermarket recycle bin and the Franciscan Center has been happy to receive them."
