Well4Africa: Accompanying the Porter for January 2020 is a letter from Tibor Kauser our General Minister, providing us with an update on the Well4Africa initiative. As many of you may already know, this initiative was born as a particular fruit of the 3rd European OFS and YouFra Congress, which took place in Lithuania, 20-26 August, 2018. The purpose of this initiate was to ensure safe drinking water for three different communities in Uganda, Zimbabwe, and Malawi. After the Congress, seeing the big support from other National fraternities, the CIOFS Presidency decided that "Well4Africa" became a permanent project for the entire Secular Franciscan Order ensuring its management to the National Council of Lithuania.

Thanks to the common efforts of European Franciscan Family and people of good will, current financial situation of "Well4Africa" is as follows: The total amount collected from the beginning of the initiative up to 8 December 2019 was **97 693 Eur**. The amount spent on projects by 8 December 2019 was **60,945 Eur**. And the amount left for upcoming projects was **36 748 Eur**.

You can follow update numbers, current and upcoming projects in well4africa.eu front page. Well4Africa has fully implemented 2 projects and has two ongoing projects. This apostolate presents a great opportunity for Saint Conrad's Fraternity, especially in our charitable contributions throughout the year. It would allow us to join in fraternity with our regional, national and international sisters and brothers in prayer and annual support.
