Our Dorothy Day apostolate is still very active on the 4rh Sunday of the month.



Our Lady of Fatima — May 13

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese children–Francisco and Jacinta Marto



and their cousin Lucia dos Santos-received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria near Fatima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. Mary asked the children to pray the rosary for world peace, for the end of World War I, for sinners, and for the conversion of Russia. Mary gave the children three secrets. Following the deaths of Francisco and Jacinta in 1919 and 1920 respectively, Lucia revealed the first secret in 1927. It concerned devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The second secret was a vision of hell. When Lucia grew up she became a Carmelite nun and died in 2005 at the age of 97. Pope John Paul II directed the Holy See's Secretary of State to reveal the third secret in 2000; it spoke of a "bishop in white" who was shot by a group of soldiers who fired bullets and arrows into him. Many people linked this vision to the assassination attempt against Pope John Paul II in St. Peter's Square on May 13, 1981. The feast of Our Lady of Fatima was approved by the local bishop in 1930; it was added to the Church's worldwide calendar in 2002.

St. Joan of Arc — May 30


Burned at the stake as a heretic after a politically -motivated trial, Joan was beatified in 1909 and canonized in 1920.

Born of a fairly well-to-do peasant couple in Domremy-Greux southeast of Paris, Joan was only 12 when she experienced a vision and heard voices that she later identified as Saints Michael the Archangel, Catherine of Alexandria, and Margaret of Antioch.



During the Hundred Years War, Joan led French

troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. In the end, she was condemned for wearing men's clothes. The English resented France's military success—to which Joan contributed. Remembered by most people for her military exploits, Joan had a great love for the sacraments, which strengthened her compassion toward the poor. Popular devotion to her increased greatly in 19th-century France and later among French soldiers during World War I. Theologian George Tavard writes that her life "offers a perfect example of the conjunction of contemplation and action" because her spiritual insight is that there should be a "unity of heaven and earth."



This is part two of my writing of Our Father Francis's understanding of scripture and prophecy.

After one of his overseas trips, Francis preached at Celano and was invited to dinner by a knight. He and his companions accepted and went to the knight's home. Upon arrival, he gave praise to God in prayer. He then told the host to confess all his sins and to be prepared to be rewarded by God for giving the poor such a warm welcome. The knight did as he asked and prepared himself for death after putting all of his affairs in order. When they sat down to eat, the knight dropped dead as was foretold by Francis. He was given the ultimate reward of heaven for his hospitality typical of a prophet and given to a prophet. The knight had heeded the warning of Francis of his pending death and escaped eternal damnation in spite of his military career.

While Francis was sick at Rieti, there was a loosely living man by the name of Gedeon. He made arrangements to be brought to Francis to ask him to bless him with the sign of the cross. But Francis objected stating that he did not seek forgiveness from God for his indulgences. But he agreed to do it anyway at the insistence of Gedeon's friends. He admonished Gedeon of a more severe wrath if he continued his sinful ways after his cure. He was immediately cured after Francis made the sign of the cross. Gedeon arose and began to praise God for being saved, but unfortunately returned to his sinful tendencies.. One evening, after dining with a friend and then retiring for the night, the roof of the house collapsed. All but Gedeon were able to escape, he being trapped and killed by God's retribution for his apparent ungratefulness.

A woman came to Francis one day for assistance with her husband. He was cruel to her and prevented her from serving Christ. She asked him to pray for him that God may turn hum around. He told her to go in peace and that her husband will have a change of heart. But he also asked her to tell him that retribution will still follow after a time of mercy. She did as he requested going off. Her husband, having been changed by the Holy Spirit, responded with, "Let us serve God together and save our souls." They both lived the rest of their lives in marital bliss and died together.

St. Francis became duly noted for his supernatural gifts from God providing all sorts of miracle cures and predictions of the future and revealing of secrets in consciences, comparable to the prophet Elias.

St. Francis informed a friend of his in Siena what his future would be. A theologian heard of this and approached him about it upon which Francis also gave hum a prediction of the theologian's future. To future confirm this prediction, Francis also told the theologian of a conflict he had on his conscience and advised him on how to resolve it. The learned theologian eventually died exactly the way Francis predicted.

Part IV ... The Call


Hail, radiant maiden, Maria,
