SPIRITUAL ASSISTANT'S MESSAGE

June, 2020

This is the third part of my article on St. Francis's understanding of Scripture and prophecy.

Francis and one of his companions, Brother Leonard of Assisi, were one day on the way home from overseas. They were both tired and worn out from their trip. Francis was riding on a donkey, and Brother Leonard walking besides. Brother Leonard began to complain of this thinking his family better off than Francis'. Just after he thought this, Francis dismantled from the donkey and stated just what Brother Leonard thought: he of noble birth had to walk while Francis of a less worthy family, rode. Brother Leonard was embarrassed by this incident, became sorrowful and asked Francis for forgiveness, having been caught by his ability to read the secrets of people's minds.

Another friar presumed that whoever enjoyed and followed the Saint's affection would also enjoy God's favor and that if Francis turned down one's friendship, God would reject him. He longed for a close relationship with Francis, but never let anyone know. Francis called upon him one day and told him not to be concerned about this. The friar was in his favor and due for all of his special treatment and affection. The friar was amazed and became even more attached to Francis and even grew in greater gifts by the Holy Spirit.

While St. Francis resided in his cell in La Verna, one of his companions wanted to acquire some short Bible phrases from the Saint in his own handwriting. He was being harassed by a violent demonic spirit and wanted to end it by possession of the Bible phrases. But he could not bring himself to ask Francis for such a request. Francis, of course, with the intercession of the Holy Spirit, learned of the companion's predicament and told him to come to him with pen and paper. He wrote a number of Scripture phrases, praising God and even wrote a blessing for the friar. Francis told him to keep the paper in his possession always. When he happily did, the demon spirit vanished immediately. The paper was preserved and found to work countless miracles for quite some time, testifying to the healing power of Francis.

There was another friar who was exceptionally holy, living an exemplary life. He spent all of his time in prayer, making his confession by signing as if he were speaking to the deaf. Francis came one day to the friary and requested to see the friar. When the brothers praised this friar, Francis admonished them saying, "Please do not praise him like that, it is a trick of the devil....a temptation of Satan himself." But the friars were not convinced of this and disregarded Francis' warning. But a few days later, the pious friar abandoned the order, confirming what Francis said about him.

Francis often predicted the fall from grace of those who seem firm in their faith and devotion and conversely the conversion of those who were confirmed to be evil. He had the accurate ability of seeing clearly what occurred in the distance behind the scenes as if he himself possessed the eternal light.

Mirror of Perfection

LETS REALLY CELEBRATE THESE AMAZING JUNE FEAST DAYS!

St. Anthony of Padua — June 13



Anthony died at the age of just thirty-five in 1231, about five years after Saint Francis had died. He was canonized less than one year later. In 1946 Saint Anthony was declared a Doctor of the Church due to the richness of his sermons and writings. He was conscious as he succumbed to death. In his last moments, the brothers surrounding his bed asked him if he saw anything. Saint Anthony said simply, "I see the Lord."

Saint Anthony of Padua, we seek your powerful intercession to have the right words on our lips to inspire the faithful and to correct and guide the ignorant. Through your example, may our words also be buttressed by our powerful witness to Christ.

Today's feast is placed three months after the Annunciation, on March 25, because that gospel scene tells us that Elizabeth, John's mother, was six months pregnant at the time. Three more months take us to June 24. (The one day discrepancy between March 25 and June 24 is an accident of counting. If December and June each had thirty-one days there would be no discrepancy.) Three related feast days line up beautifully: March 25, the Annunciation; June 24, the birth of

John the Baptist; December 25, the birth of Christ. John's birth foretells Christ's birth. Although the historical chronology may not be exact, the dates show the theological interconnection among the three feasts.

All parents are naturally curious to discover the sex of their child in utero. Some allow themselves to be told the sex. Others wait in suspense. Elizabeth and Zechariah were told by a winged messenger of God Himself that they would have a boy. That little boy grew to be a man, a great man, who accepted death rather than swallow his words criticizing the powerful Herod Antipas. John ran ahead of Christ, clearing the ground so that the Lord's pathway would be clear. This forerunner baptized the Christ, preached and prophesied like the Christ, fasted and prayed like the Christ, and died for the truth like the Christ. But he did not rise from the dead like the Christ. There is only one Easter. We rejoice at Saint John the Baptist's birth, because what followed merits rejoicing. We rejoice at his birth, because we rejoice at the great and generous God who intervenes in our lives, who discovers us before we discover Him.
