

ST. MOTHER THERESA OF CALCUTTA — SEPT.5



She equals in holiness and generosity the great 'Teresas' she chose to emulate. Anjezë (Agnes) Gonxha Bojaxhiu was a tiny Albanian woman whose strong-as-iron faith served as a fulcrum to budge the world closer to God. She was born into a devout family in Skopje, in present day Macedonia. Her parent's marriage had been arranged, according to custom, and was happy and fruitful. The family was prosperous and regularly helped the poor and abandonedFeeling the call to serve Christ and the Church, Agnes decided to become a nun with the Loretto Sisters who were based in Dublin, Ireland. So when she was eighteen, a large procession of family, classmates, and parishioners accompanied her to Skopje's train stationMother Teresa became internationally famous, an icon of charity and peace, for all the right reasons. After her death it was revealed that she struggled to feel God's presence

for much of her life but persevered in prayer and sacrifice nonetheless. She was constructed of steel, in perpetual motion, and operated on almost no food or sleep. All of her religious sisters are similarly indestructible. She was canonized by


Pope Francis in 2016.

St. Pio of Pietrelcina (Padre Pio), Priest—SEPT. 23

Pio's life fused with Christ's so totally that Pio's very body bore the marks of his beloved. Not the same haircut, clothes, or gait, but the same nail marks and bloody wounds. Father Pio merged with Christ such that to look upon the friar's hands was to see the crucified palms of the Son of God on Calvary. Padre Pio grew up dirt poor and uneducated in a village near Naples, Italy, in 1887. Neither his parents nor his grandparents could read or write. He was baptized as Francesco and helped on the family's small plot of land as a boy. The family was deep-

ly religious, in the good, medieval way that perdured in rural, southern Europe far longer than it did in northern lands. Beginning in 1918 he began to experience the stigmata, or marks of the sufferings of Christ. He bled where Christ bled. Holes perforated his hands. He had sharp pains in his side. He also began to display supernatural gifts: bilocation, prophecy, miracles, and healings. His personal routine of prayer and mortification was itself stupefying. He did not want his private passion to play out in public, but it did. He became famous in Italy for being holy. Then he became widely known the world over. By the time of his death in 1968, Padre Pio was a bona fide Catholic superstar.

Padre Pio had mystique. That mystique was not rooted in good looks, a chateau on the Côte d'Azur, or in movie roles. It was how he said Mass.



United by their vocation as "brothers and sisters of penance" and motivated by the dynamic power of the Gospel, let them conform their thoughts and deeds to those of Christ by means of the radical interior change that the Gospel itself calls "conversion". Human frailty makes it necessary that this conversion be carried out daily.

Chapter two, Rule #7

Continuing our discussion on conversion, our Father Francis's whole eighteen years as a religious was one continuous conversion spectrum. As his life underwent change(internally and at times radically during the period of 1208 to 1226), he increasingly realized and then preached about Jesus Christ as a model to imitate and not just one to be prayerfully called upon to fix problems. This imitative practice is to be the main thrust of our personal conversion or real inner change of our hearts: a change done after much reflection, discernment, pondering and its gradual integration into our everyday routine lives. We must be fully aware that this conversion is to be with us for the rest of our lives and must be carefully and properly done. It should not include the following:

*When we encounter a matter that brings on a prejudice of ours, we find ourselves to simply dismiss it as "an exception to the rule" and make no effort at realizing our opinion and attitude to be prejudicial.

*Changing our behavior and thoughts because they seem appropriate and comfortable and because others have taken them on as practices. This is change, yes, but for what reason? Have we given it enough time to consider whether it really reflects our true thoughts or not or were we inclined to make the change because it looks favorable by others? Would we want it to become a permanent characteristic of our lives?

*The tendency toward "putting on airs" or outwardly showing a behavioral change without the prompting of a radical interior change. We try to hide our lack of desire to undergo a conversion to a better and more Christian and Franciscanfriendly position. This is actually more critical than simply refusing to let our heart be converted. We should never let our conversion be "skin deep". It tends to make us deceptive and disappointing in our character to others.

Conversion is, a main Franciscan characteristic: a continuous changing of heart and spiritual renewal needed to give us the ability to take on the manner of Jesus Christ. In Francis's letter to us, which was in the prologue to The Rule, if we are totally in love with our Lord and promote a community united in the Eucharist, then we become a model of Christ and thus follow God's will eliminating all actions that keep us from becoming one with Him. The daily conversion we need to carry out, thus, is essential in conforming ourselves to Him.

He summoned the crowd with His disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come

After me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save

His life will lose it but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it."

(Mark 8: 34 - 35)
