The Youthful Francis, from *The Legend of the Three Companions*

One evening in Assisi, his friends chose Francis to be in charge of festivities, so that, according to his whim, he would pay their expenses. He made arrangements for a sumptuous banquet, as he had done so often in the past.

When they left the house bloated, his friends walked ahead of him, singing throughout the city. Holding in his hand the scepter of his office as their leader, he fell slightly behind them. He was not singing, but was deeply preoccupied. Suddenly he was visited by the Lord who filled his heart with so much tenderness that he was unable to speak or move. He could only feel and hear this marvelous tenderness; it left him so estranged from any sensation that, as he himself said later, even if he had been completely cut to pieces, he would not have been able to move.

When his companions glanced back and saw him so removed from them, they went back surprised at seeing him already *changed into another man*. They asked him: "What were you thinking about that you did not follow us? Were you perhaps thinking about taking a wife?"

He answered in an unequivocal voice: "You are right! I was thinking about taking a wife more noble, wealthier, and more beautiful than you have ever seen." They laughed at him. For he said this not of his own accord, but because he was inspired by God. In fact, the bride was the true religion that he later embraced, a bride more noble, richer and more beautiful because of her poverty.

From that very hour he began to consider himself of little value and to despise those things which he had previously held in love. Since he was not entirely detached from worldly vanities, this change was not yet perfect.





DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL

(Updated: February, 2021)

COUNCIL

COMPOSITION:

Minister
Vice Minister

DUTIES OF THE COUNCIL:

- 1. To promote the initiatives for fostering fraternal life, for improving the human, Christian, and Franciscan formation of its members.
- 2. To make concrete and courageous choices, appropriate for the situation of the Fraternity, especially Apostolates.
- 3. To accept and admit to profession new members.
- 4. To animate and guide the Fraternity.
- 5. To establish fraternal dialogue with members in particular difficulties and adopt appropriate measures.
- 6. To receive requests for withdrawal and decide on suspension of a member from the Fraternity.
- 7. To decide on use of available funds.
- 8. To assign duties to councilors and/or other professed members.
- 9. To request the competent superiors of the four orders for suitable religious assistants.
- 10. To perform those other duties as identified in the Constitution and statutes.

MINISTER

The Minister, as the primary person for the fraternity, shares co-responsibility with the Council to guide the fraternity. The Minister is expected to put into practice the decisions of the Council and will keep the Council informed about what he/she is doing.

DUTIES:

- 1. To call, preside and direct the meetings of the Council and Fraternity, to prepare an agenda for the meetings.
- 2. To convoke an election chapter of the Fraternity every three (3) years.
- 3. To prepare annual reports to be sent to the Council of higher level after it has been approved by the Council of the fraternity
- 4. To exhibit both in word and action a genuine commitment to the Gospel and Franciscan way of life.
- 5. To request, with the consent of the Council, the pastoral and fraternal visits, at least once every three (3) years.
- 6. To put into effect those acts which the Rule and Constitution refer to his/her competence.

VICE-MINISTER

The Vice-Minister should be prepared to assist and support the Minister, and to assume complete responsibility for the Fraternity when the Minister is absent or sick. The Vice-Minister should possess qualities of leadership, allowing him/her to lead others.

DUTIES:

- 1. To collaborate in a fraternal spirit and support the Minister.
- 2. To exercise the functions entrusted by the Council.
- 3. To take the place of the Minister in both duties and responsibilities in the event of absence or temporary impediment.
- 4. To assume the functions of the Minister when the office remains vacant.
- 5. To resume (temporarily) function of absent councilors.

SECRETARY

The Secretary is someone who is "the right hand of the Council and the Minister". He/she is responsible for recording the salient points of every meeting; accurate historically, and interestingly written. The Secretary is the historian and archivist of the Fraternity.

DUTIES:

- 1. To record and complete the official acts of the Fraternity and of the Council.
- 2. To update and preserve records i.e. Fraternity roster, admissions, professions, deaths, withdrawals and transfers.
- 3. To provide pertinent important facts to the various levels as directed by the Council.

TREASURER

The Treasurer is responsible for the common fund, contributions, and disbursements of finances of the Fraternity. The Treasurer is a permanent member of the Council.

DUTIES:

- 1. To maintain and keep accurate accounts of all financial transactions of the Fraternity.
- 2. To report monthly to the Council as to the status of all those transactions.
- 3. To prepare with the Council the annual report to the region.
- 4. To send to the region the annual fair share contribution from the Fraternity.
- 5. To prepare the annual budget with the Council.

FORMATION DIRECTOR

The Formation Director is the agent of information for all members, so that all brothers/sisters and candidates will be enlivened by the Holy Spirit to follow Christ in the pattern and rule that St. Francis gave. He/she must have knowledge of documents, general Constitution, OFS Rule, Vatican II and changes in Church and the Franciscan Order.

DUTIES:

- 1. To coordinate the formative activities of the Fraternity.
- 2. To instruct and enliven the inquirers during the time of formation, the candidates and the professed.
- 3. To inform the Council of the Fraternity prior to profession concerning the suitability of the candidate for commitment to the Rule.
- 4. To assist the Minister in the ceremonies of Welcoming, Rite of Admission, and Profession.
- 5. To arrange the Retreat Day prior to Rite of Admission and Profession.
- 6. To arrange and apply a yearly schedule of ongoing formation.
- 7. To report monthly on the status of all in initial formation.

COUNCILOR – INFIRMARIAN

The Councilor – Infirmarian is the primary contact with those Fraternity members who are sick and infirmed and represents the entire Fraternity in extending charity to those Fraternity members in need.

DUTIES:

- 1. To accept all communications about the sick and infirmed (i.e. phone, e-mail, etc.).
- 2. To inform the entire community about the requests for prayers.
- 3. To visit or organize visits to the sick and infirmed when possible.
- 4. To report to the Council monthly.
- 5. To send appropriate cards and / or notes (sympathy, get-well, other special occasions).
- 6. To remember Fraternity members who have died in various Fraternity prayer services.
- 7. To submit expenses for cards, postage, travel, etc. to the Treasurer.

COUNCILOR AT LARGE

The Councilor at Large serves by providing his / her input into the deliberations of the Council and by performing duties assigned by the Minister.

DUTIES:

- 1. To be willing to perform tasks that will facilitate the smooth operation of the Council and the Fraternity as assigned by the Minister.
- 2. To perform other administrative or organizational tasks as needed.
