October The Month of the Rosary

If the Rosary is not part of one's daily prayer life, October is certainly the month to pray this beautiful devotion.

Edward Sri, author and theologian suggests that wherever one may be in relationship to God, one "can experience a profound, intimate personal encounter with Jesus" through praying the rosary.

Dr. Sri offers these suggestions:

"First, we don't have to pray the rosary all at once. We can say a decade or two at different times of the day.

Second, we can pray it anywhere! The rosary is like a portable chapel. We can keep in our pocket and pull it out anytime, anyplace.

Third we can pray the rosary in different ways, customizing it to fit the needs of the moment.

Sometimes we might focus on the words of the prayer, thinking for example of Gabriel's greeting to Our Lady as we slowly say with great devotion, 'Hail Mary full of grace the Lord is with thee'. At other time we might reflect on the

mysteries of Christ's life, prayerfully contemplating the different scenes. At still other times, we might focus on the holy name of Jesus at the center of each Hail Mary, speaking his name tenderly with love as the pulse of our rosary. Lastly, even if we are not able to give the rosary our full attention, it's still worth praying. We might be tired, distracted and unable to reach the heights of contemplation. But still, the words themselves our biblical and holy. Offering God a decade or two in the midst of our daily life gives him something beautiful." It is also a gift to Our Blessed Lady and a special way to honor her and ask for her intercession.

Let us not forget our Franciscan Crown to meditate on the joys of our Lady.

During October, may our Blessed Mother, help us to go deeper into the prayer of the Rosary.
