


### The Light of Assisi - The Story of Saint Clare by Margaret Carney, OSF

I haven't read this book yet, but I want to share this recently published story.

The author says in the forward, explains that "the purpose of the book is simple: to introduce St. Clare of Assisi to those who do not know her and those who wish to know her better. Clare's story shows us that we need only have the courage to unlock what is within us, to spend our days powered by the graced anointing that we already possess."

This straightforward biography tells the story of this medieval woman from her birth to her death and canonization. Carney draws special attention to Clare's significant contribution to the Franciscan world in the many years following Francis' death. Far from merely reflecting Francis' light, Clare had her own charism, "a gift bestowed by the Spirit of the Lord and given to her in a fullness and forcefulness that was hers alone."

### **FEAST OF SAINT PADRE PIO OF PIETRELCINA**



Where: The National Centre for Padre Pio, 111 Barto Road, Barto, PA 19504

**Details:** Both the Rosary at 11:30 am, and the Mass at noon, will be held in the Chapel on Thursday, September 23 to celebrate the Feast Day of St. Pio.



**Costs:** Travel expenses, plus any items purchased in the gift shop. There is an onsite mini cafe with coffee and baked goods which is open some days (not all). There are also restaurants nearby should you choose to eat out, and of course cost depends on what you order. For example, close by is the Americana Diner, 682 PA-100, Bechtelsville, PA 19505 – it is 2.9 miles from the Centre. However, we encourage you to pack a lunch to eat with other OFS members for more time for fellowship.

**Other info:** There is a museum and gift shop there, as well as the chapel. The museum is free of charge and has many wonderful artifacts from the life of St. Pio. The gift shop has many wonderful items for sale – books, rosaries, candles that can be lit at the shrine, statues, etc. People should pack their own lunch.
