

Mike Huether is staring a new series for his monthly Spiritual Assistant's Message. We all found inspiration on his writings about the Peace Prayer. Now we are on to a new topic!



Hopefully all of you enjoyed my series of messages on the prayer we all love as Franciscans: that of the Peace Prayer of St. Francis. So, starting with this month, the month we celebrate the feast of the Stigmata of our Father Francis, September 17, I will have for you a series of messages on this great turning event of his life as well as what effects the stigmatization had on his life thereafter. Again, I base these next few writings of mine for you on a reference I read entitled, "Franciscan Perfection" by Ce`saire de Tours, OFM Cap.

On one morning close to the feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross, Francis was blessed with a vision of a seraph with six wings of fire which appeared and hovered in the air before him. Between the wings, there was a figure of a man nailed to as cross by his hands and feet. Two of the wings were extended above the man's head; two were spread out in flight; and two covered his body. Francis gazed at this figure with both joy and sorrow: joyful at the sight of he knew was Christ, but sadness to see Him nailed to a cross. The figure imparted a divine revelation to him explaining the meaning of this mysterious appearance. He soon understood by it that he was to be transformed into a likeness of the crucified Lord, but not by martyrdom, but by his ardent love of Him in his soul.

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This transformation began immediately. The first appearance was of the marks of the nails in his hands and feet in the same way he observed them in the vision of the crucified figure. The heads of the nails could be seen in the palms of his hands and on the upper part of his feet close to his ankles. The points of the nails protruded on the other sides and were long and bent back. On his right side, a red wound appeared looking as if he were pierced with a lance. Blood flowed from this wound staining his undergarment and habit

Celano, who witnessed this sacred event of the Stigmata, described it similarly this way. As a historian, he states it as such: "We who tell of these things, have seen them with our own eyes; we have touched with our hands that which these same hands here set down in writing.....Many Friars besides ourselves saw this while the saint was living, and, after his death, more than fifty friars and innumerable seculars venerated the sacred wounds." The Stigmata is the best authenticated event of the whole history of the saint: an event which cannot be adequately explained. As Celano continues: "This mystery has been shown in the flesh because it could not be explained in words......Therefore, let our silence speak where adequate words are lacking; where expression fails us, the figure of Francis, marked with the Stigmata, proclaims the miracle."

The sovereign popes have solemnly verified the truth of the Stigmata event by instituting the Feast of the Impression of the Stigmata of St. Francis to honor the solemnity of this miracle and to keep it sacred throughout the whole Catholic Church.

According to mystic writers, the bestowing of the Stigmata is granted as either a reward freely done by God to one for his contemplation, or as a disposition given to elevate to the mystical union. According to P. Seraphin, C.P., God gave them to St. Francis after he entered the perfect union, therefore, the wounds were a reward granted.

Three wonderful effects produced by the Stigmata in Francis were, A sharing in the sufferings and privileges of the Crucified Christ, The anticipated glorification of his body, and the alternatives to original justice. I will expound on these starting with next month.
