Greetings from Brother Lawrence

As I write this, the war in Ukraine is still going on and, although I hope it would be stopped by the time you read this, such is likely not to be. This is a sad state of affairs for our world, but it is not something unexpected when reading world history. War and violence are always at our doorstep. Violence in the city, state, nation, and between nations seem to be events of which those who rule seem to not care about nor concern themselves with. We believe that a large part of the people who make up the world are followers of religions and faiths which continually seek peace, but it does not seem to show too much. So, we need to turn to God to help us in our need.

God has given to each of us a free will, but we do not seem to understand what it is nor exactly what it is for. Free will, by many today, judging from what I hear in class and from adults, is our ability to choose what we want or believe to be right. From my own understanding, free will is given to us by God to be able to freely choose what God wants of us; *it is the freedom to choose what God wants of us*. When we come to realize what God wants of each of us, we have the freedom to choose to do that. Instead, what often seems to happen, is that we choose what we want, what is best for us, and it is this that leads to wars and violence. Another way of referring to this is that we often choose our own personal selfishness.

I have been thinking of this because I have been pondering recently why we, as good Christians in the world, cannot, or, perhaps, prefer not to discover what God is asking of each and every one of us. Our own self continues to block our freedom to choose what God is asking of us. I have come to the conclusion over the years that selfishness is the root cause of all that is evil in our world. We, as Franciscans, need to work to realize that there is nothing any of us wants that can be better than what God wants. Minister's Moment

November is a contemplative month for me. We begin the month with All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day, in the middle there is Veterans' Day, and the month ends with my father's memorial day. All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day make us conscious of those who have entered heaven before us. As we witnessed in the *Transitus* last month, Saint Francis embraced Sister Death. He asked to be brought to the chapel of St. Mary of the Angels. There he forgave anyone who asked his forgiveness and blessed all those who were away. He made plans for when he would no longer be there to guide his brothers. He asked his friends to come and promised that those who could not come, they would have time to mourn him.

While it seems to be a morbid task, we should take steps to plan for the time that we, too, embrace Sister Death. My father had taken certain steps to plan for his death, but it came rather unexpectedly and our family had to make many decisions that might not have been what he desired. Estate planning is not for just the wealthy, and one shouldn't leave it for later. "The goal is to communicate your end-of-life healthcare wishes and document what you have, who gets it after you die, and set up a trouble-free way to transfer it to your heirs or preferred charities, while minimizing payouts to probate courts, attorneys, accountants, and the government." *

We should make some plans for our survivors. This month, as we celebrate those who have gone before us, take time to write out your desires. It might be a document that your store with a copy of your Will, and Advanced Directive. You may even want to include this information *in* your Will so that it is enforceable (check with an estate attorney for Maryland laws). For planning purposes, you can also decide what your Franciscan Wake and Burial wishes would be.

Finally, think about the tasks that St. Francis completed. He made sure that he forgave everyone, prayed for everyone, let his friends and family care for him, and acknowledged that there would be those who mourned for him. May we be so generous as well.



(Cont. from page 1.) Let us hope that we can see clear to put others before ourselves and God first and foremost overall. Let us pray that such an attitude begins to spread everywhere: in Baltimore, in Maryland, in the United States, and in the world; we need to put an end to selfishness.

We can begin in small ways. When you check out at a store, say nice things and make the check-out person's day. When we are driving let us carefully and safely drive and not speed and drive recklessly and putting the safety of others at risk. Let us be careful to choose people who practice a "theology of otherness," as I call it. We may never have a real impact on the Ukraine situation, but we can begin one in our neighborhoods and locally. From there it can really spread. May God continue to give us the ideas that we want for us, for us to see and understand what is best for each of us and not to think that we know better than God does. With just the beginning of doing these God-things even at a small level we may find that this Thanksgiving will be one worth giving thanks to God.
