APOSTLESHIP OF THE SEA CHRISTMAS SHOE BOX

In December, our fraternity has traditionally put together gift boxes for merchant seafarers who visit the Port of Baltimore. We did this because they were often far from home on Christmas; and now with the pandemic, cannot even come ashore for shopping. We are reviving this Apostolate this year.

There are 3 ways to help:

- 1) If you wish to fill a shoe box, you can bring it to the Fraternity meeting on December 18. Please remember that there are also women Seafarers as well!! Chose a sturdy shoe box (but not a boot box), stuff it full of some of the items below, and wrap it with festive paper. See the list of suggested items below.
- 2) You could send a check to the Apostleship of the Sea at 320 Cathedral Street; Baltimore, MD 21202.
- 3) You can order items in bulk (like socks, warm hats, or gloves) and bring them to the Dec. 10th fraternity meeting. We'll deliver them to Dundalk with the gift boxes.

Suggested contents:

Toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, combs, nail clippers, mouthwash, shampoos, comb/brush, hand sanitizer, lip balm

Hair conditioners, soap, shaving cream, deodorant, Q-tips, disposable razors

Socks, gloves, scarves, knit "watch caps" that cover the head and ears

Ball caps, pens, pencils, writing supplies, English dictionaries, 2022 calendars, pocket-sized address books/planners

Scotch tape, playing cards, travel sized games, reading materials (magazines, paperbacks)

Non-perishable foods/snacks/candy (no chocolate- it melts!) and a small Christmas card or blessing signed from a member, or members, of the Fraternity.

The International Board of Directors of Franciscans International (FI) met in New York City from November 15-20, 2022. On November 16th, we had the extraordinary opportunity to meet at the United Nations (UN) with Deputy Secretary-General Amina J. Mohammed, in which she highlighted the important role played by faith-based organizations in promoting the rights and dignity of all people and respect for our common home.

The Deputy Secretary-General offered us an invitation: to help top UN level personnel connect with the local communities. Our response to her was the assurance of our help and support with those connections. Ms. Mohammed conveyed to us her deep faith in God as she navigates the difficulties of work and life.

FI works with Franciscans and other partners around the world to bring the local community voices to the UN, where we provide a platform to advocate for concrete and positive change.

We are challenged and motivated by our conversation with a person at the highest level of the UN system who allows her faith to inspire her service to the international community. We look forward to future opportunities whereby we might link the work of Franciscans on the ground with resources available within the UN for the promotion of human rights, integral human development, and care for creation.

YOUR VOICE IS NEEDED TO STOP ASSISTED SUICIDE IN MARYLAND!!

The Maryland Legislature has pre-filed a bill to legalize assisted suicide in the 2023 session. The aim of this bill is to actively allow a person with a 6-month prognosis, to kill themselves by overdosing on medication prescribed by a medical provider. There are many things inherently wrong with this bill such as

- no mandatory evaluation for depression
- a six -months- to- live terminal prognosis is not reliable
- pain is not the primary reason people are requesting to die-but rather disability issues: fear of loss of autonomy, quality of life, and dignity
- no medical oversight once the prescription is written and dispense

Do not hesitate to voice your concerns by emailing your legislators. As a constituent, your voice carries a lot of weight and will make a difference in how your representative will vote. Since the bill is pre-filed, it may move quickly when the legislative session begins in January, which is why we are asking you to contact them now. Visit the Maryland Right to Life Website at mdrtl.org. Go to the TAKE ACTION tab to send a message directly to your legislators asking them to vote against this bill. The Dignity Mandate (https://thedignitymandate.org/) is another great nonprofit dedicated to educating Marylanders about the dangers of assisted suicide. Be sure to watch the 30-minute documentary on their website detailing the some of the problems with the proposed Maryland bill. Visit their website at thedignitymandate.org.
