Minister's Minute:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are Family. We are Fraternity. We are united by the Spirit and called to work together to build up the Church with our love and service and care for one another and those we encounter. Rule 6 speaks to me of this call--"They have been made living members of the Church by being buried and raised with Christ in Baptism; they have been united more intimately with the Church by profession. Therefore they should go forth as witnesses and instruments of her mission among all people, proclaiming Christ by their life and words. Called like St. Francis to REBUILD the Church and inspired by his example, let them devote themselves energetically to living in full communion with the pope, bishops, and priests, fostering an open and trusting dialogue of apostolic effectiveness and creativity."

Archbishop Lori declared last year the Year of the Eucharist ending on the feast of Corpus Christi with a procession. The Bishops have continued the emphasis on the Eucharist in a 3-Year National Eucharistic Revival with encouragement to pray for bishops and priests and to pray for increased love and faith in Jesus truly present at Mass and when we adore Him in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Have you read The Sisters of Life publication IMPRINT this month with a focus on the above Eucharistic Revival? Wonderful testimonies of the Sisters inviting people in New York into St. Patrick's Cathedral where the people had LIFE-giving encounters with Jesus present on the altar in the monstrance. The Sisters write about Eucharistic miracles like Lanciano, Saints devoted to the Eucharist like Blessed Acutis, the healing power of the Mass and prayer.

So how do we--like St. Francis--"rebuild the Church"? Jon Sweeney in his book "When Saint Francis Saved the Church" (Ave Maria Press) discusses six ways Francis created a spiritual VISION for the ages. He began with friendship. How would you begin? OBITUARY: Fr. Frank Jacobi, Spiritual Assistant - November 1995 - May 2001

Francis Yacobi, OFM Cap., died at AGH West Penn Hospital, Pittsburgh, on Saturday evening, December 31, 2022, following several months of declining health. He was 73. Francis was born to Xavier Francis and Anne (Petty) Yacobi on May 11, 1949, in South Bend, IN, and was baptized at St. Joseph Church, the family's parish. He graduated from Marian Catholic High School, Chicago Heights, IL, in 1967. Frank earned Business Administration degrees in marketing and management at Northern Illinois University.

Frank was accepted into the Capuchin formation program and took pre-theology courses at Borromeo Seminary in Wickliffe, OH, from 1983 to 1984. In 1984 he was invested as a Capuchin novice at St. Conrad Friary, Allison Park, PA. professed temporary vows as a Capuchin friar on July 13, 1985, and perpetual vows on August 2, 1988. He studied theology at Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, attaining a Master of Divinity in 1989. After serving a unique year of diaconate year in the diocesan parish of St. William's in Euclid, OH, Frank was ordained to the priesthood on June 2, 1990.

His first assignment was to the missions in Papua New Guinea, initially in Ialibu as parochial vicar and then in Madang to serve on the faculty of St. Fidelis Seminary. Frank returned from the missions in 1993 and was assigned to St. Joseph Parish in York, PA, as parochial vicar. In 2011 to pastor the people of St. Callistus Parish in Philadelphia and to assist with the formation of postulants in residence at the nearby friary of Blessed Sacrament parish. Two years later, he was named Guardian of that West Philadelphia fraternity and director of the postulancy program.

In 2016, Frank was appointed to serve in the Provincial headquarters as executive secretary and was named guardian of St. Conrad Friary in Allison Park. Frank was always ready to serve

the Province in his capacity as a canon lawyer.

Throughout his Capuchin life, Frank had an affection for the Secular Franciscan Order, serving as Spiritual Assistant to fraternities in Washington, Annapolis [November 1995 - May 2001] and Western Pennsylvania. He was also Spiritual Assistant to the Poor Clares of Perpetual Adoration, providing guidance for the Sisters in Ohio, Virginia, Washington, and Alabama.

Frank was also committed to the Capuchin Volunteer Corps of the Province, serving as a member of the Board and assisting director Margaret McIntyre as needed.

Remember, when making your donation to the fraternity, use the memo line of your check to designate where you wish your contribution to be directed. There are three possible designations:

- **COM** Common Fund (this covers fraternity operations and the Sabu family in India)
- **BUS** bus tokens for the Light House shelter clients
- **Phoenix** Phoenix Academy 'backpack' food program

In case you are unfamiliar with some of these organizations, below is some very brief description of their mission and a link to their website for more information.

Little Friends for Peace -- seeks to eradicate violence by teaching skills for peace. They have formed adult peace circles in Washington D.C and peace camps for youth. It's an interesting story and we hope they will accept an invitation to speak to our fraternity. https://www.lffp.org/

Casa Franciscana Outreach (CFO) -- The Casa Franciscana Mission in Guaymas, Sonora, Mexico dates back to 1968, when the Mexican Obregon Diocese asked the Franciscan Province of Saint Barbara, CA, USA to provide pastoral care to the English-speaking community in San Carlos, Mexico. The friars agreed to minister this care to the San Carlos community under the condition that they could also serve the poor in the neighboring city of Guaymas, Mexico. CFO was established in 1988 to raise funds for the Mission which provides food, medical, educational aid to the poor. https://casafranciscanaoutreach.org/

Ixcán Ministries – Is a Christian lay mission serving as a ministry of presence with the Maya People in the remote Ixcán jungle of Guatemala. Their programs include medical, housing, women's micro-business, food assistance, promotion of peace and justice. Recent drought has impacted food supply in the area. https://ixcanministries.org/

Amazon Relief – founded by a secular Franciscan, James Flickinger. It funds programs to feed and educate approximately 2,500 impoverished and "at risk" children living in the Amazon (year-round programs). In addition, it helped funded programs designed to assist approximately 4,500 "street children" and other poor youth. https://christianity101blog.com/amazon-relief-part-3-amys-story/

Knights Solidarity Fund (for Ukraine) -- The Knights of Columbus in the US work with the Knights in Poland and Ukraine, the Latin and Greek Catholic Churches, and partner NGOs to provide temporary shelter, food, medical supplies, clothing, religious supplies, and other humanitarian needs as identified as the situation continues to change. 100% of donations go directly to support those affected by the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine.

Fr. Patrick Monahan – our Spiritual Assistant is currently teaching English at St. Frances Academy in Baltimore. It is the

oldest continuously operating, predominantly African American Catholic High School in the United States started by Mother Mary Lange in 1828. In the past when making donations, the council has asked if there was something the school needed and Fr. Patrick would shake his head no. When asked at the last council meeting, he lit up. The chapel at the school had been used as a multipurpose room but it is the process of being cleaned out to be used as a chapel and Father Patrick would like to purchase two lectionaries for the chapel.

- 2) You could send a check to the Apostleship of the Sea at 320 Cathedral Street; Baltimore, MD 21202.
- 3) You can order items in bulk (like socks, warm hats, or gloves) and bring them to the January 21st fraternity meeting.

Suggested contents:

Toothbrushes, toothpaste, dental floss, combs, nail clippers, mouthwash, shampoos, comb/brush, hand sanitizer, lip balm

Hair conditioners, soap, shaving cream, deodorant, Q-tips, disposable razors

Socks, gloves, scarves, knit "watch caps" that cover the head and ears

Ball caps, pens, pencils, writing supplies, English dictionaries, 2022 calendars, pocket-sized address books/planners, Scotch tape, playing cards, travel sized games, reading materials (magazines, paperbacks)

Non-perishable foods/snacks/candy (no chocolate- it melts!) and a small Christmas card or blessing signed from a member, or members, of the Fraternity.


You have been the lifeline for many of these families. I thank you on behalf of them and want to assure you that your support ushers in changes they have been on looking for their family and children.
