Dear Brothers and Sisters,

HAPPY FEAST OF ST. BONAVENTURE, Seraphic Doctor and author of the Major Legend. Brother Connor has passed along a Letter from the General Ministers on the 750th Anniversary of the Death of St. Bonaventure, Feb 2, 2024. It is included here in the Porter. "As a mystic, he shows us the center from which everything originates and is fulfilled, namely Christ Crucified, who from the cross bestowed the 'fire of the Holy Spirit' by which we reach our ultimate goal: to be transferred and transformed into God, the One who fills all things and makes them good and beautiful." He called Creation a ladder to God. May he pray for the Franciscan Order.

Today we seek to be peacemakers as Franciscans embracing the cross of a country divided at so many levels but one that seeks unity and peace. We seek as Little Friends for Peace to "deescalate" the outer and inner conflict, to decrease the rhetoric and be the Instruments of Peace in a World needing that witness desperately. Some members of FAN are planning on doing just that at the polls in November as "poll chaplains" according to an article in the July/August issue of the St. Anthony Messenger.org. They will work with other faith leaders to be a de-escalating presence at the polls. Lets pray for that peace at the RNC and DNC as well. Michelle Dunn OFS, Director of FAN will be our speaker this month. Please try to attend.

This week July 17-21 the Eucharistic Congress begins in Indianapolis. Where can we can to find greater strength and grace to carry the cross than to Jesus in the Eucharist. I understand that the Congress will be televised on EWTN so lets all experience that Renewal in belief and trust in the true presence of Jesus in Eucharist and pray for our brothers and sisters who don't believe (only 30% of Catholics do). Dianne Beaven will be attending and will share with us her experience in August. She has been accepted as a Candidate. There are a couple of books that we have mentioned to encourage that personal revival. One is 30 Day Eucharistic Revival by Donald Calloway MIC and the other is 33 Days to Eucharistic Glory (www. Eucharist.us) There is also a Fatima pilgrimage with Matthew Kelly Oct 19-25, a pilgrimage retreat for Eucharistic Consecration.

The theme of this year's World Day of Grandparents and Elderly to be celebrated July 28^{th.} is "Do not cast me off in my old age" from PS 71. It was chosen "to call attention to the fact that sadly loneliness is the bitter lot in life of many elderly persons, so often the victims of the throwaway culture". In this heat and humidity I am sure many of our elderly members are not getting out as much and we aren't either so lets reach out with phone calls and notes with our love and care and compassion. St. Bonaventure – A Voice Still Relevant Today

A LETTER FROM THE GENERAL MINISTERS OF THE FIRST ORDER AND THE THIRD ORDER REGULAR ON THE 750TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DEATH OF ST. BONAVENTURE, FEBRUARY 2, 2024

To All the Brothers of the Franciscan First Order and Third Order Regular, and to All the Brothers and Sisters of the Franciscan Family

The **750th anniversary** of the death of the Seraphic Doctor (d. July 15, 1274), gives us an opportunity not only to remember and celebrate the service he rendered to the Order and the entire Church, but also to repropose him as a gift that is still valid for our time.

Aware of his importance, but also that he is not always as well known and appreciated as he should be, even within our own circles, we want to share some reflections on his life and message, certain that it will be a useful gift for us in the Franciscan Order to better live our commitment to the Church and the world.

The Ministers General writes: "It is not easy to reproduce in a few lines the theological and Franciscan richness contained in the nine volumes of the *Opera omnia* of Saint Bonaventure." They chose to highlight three areas. The sections included are:

Master of theology: with his mind on its journey toward God

As a master of theology, Bonaventure teaches us the way of intelligence tempered by wisdom; a way in which we can move from the confused darkness of the forest to a deeper understanding of our faith (enlightenment), bringing "the hidden things to light".

Minister of the Order: a passionate leader

As a minister of the Order, he reminds us of our commitment to make our lives a witness animated by a readiness for renewal (purification) so that, even in radically different temporal and cultural circumstances, our life as minors can remain a "shining mirror of holiness."

Mystic of love: affect, the pinnacle of knowledge

As a mystic, he shows us the center from which everything originates and is fulfilled, namely Christ crucified, who from the cross bestowed "the fire of the Holy Spirit" by which we reach our ultimate goal: "to be transferred" and "transformed into God," the One the One who fills all things and makes them good and beautiful.

THE PORTIUNCOLA INDULGENCE

The Portiuncola Indulgence is a special favor granted by the Pope to St. Francis at his request.

One night in 1216, Francis awoke and felt a strong impulse to enter the chapel of the Portiuncola and pray. While at prayer, Our Lord and Our Lady appeared to Francis and asked him what he desired. Thinking of others and recognizing his own sinfulness, Francis spoke. "O God, although I am a great sinner, I beseech You to grant a full pardon of all sins to all who, having repented and confessed their sins, shall visit this church."

Our Lord answered, "Francis, you ask much, but you are worthy of greater things, and greater things you shall have."

The Lord granted the Indulgence and Pope Honorius III ratified it. Originally the Indulgence was attached only to the Porticuncola. However, subsequent Popes expanded the churches in which the Indulgence can be gained.

THE PORTIUNCOLA INDULGENCE TODAY: August 2

The Indulgence, if the person gaining it is free from every sin including venial sin, remits all the temporal punishment due to sin and may be applied to the person himself or herself or to a soul in Purgatory. If there is any adherence to sin in the person gaining the Indulgence, the Indulgence becomes partial.

The Indulgence may now be gained in any basilica, cathedral, or parish church on August 2. The person wishing to gain the Indulgence must fulfill the following requirements:

- a. Intend to gain the Indulgence
- b. Be detached from all sin
- c. While in the church pray one Our Father, one Apostle's Creed, and one other prayer of the individual's choice
- d. Pray for the intentions of the Pope (prayerfully saying an Our Father and a Hail Mary will suffice although other prayers may be said)
- e. Receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Eucharist within twenty days or less, either before or after August 2nd.

GIVING CORNER: CASA FRANCISCANA

The Casa Franciscana Mission in Guaymas, Sonora, Mexico dates back to 1968, when the Mexican Obregon Diocese asked the Franciscan Province of Saint Barbara, CA, USA to provide pastoral care to the English-speaking community in San Carlos, Mexico. The friars agreed to minister this care to the San Carlos community under the condition that they could also serve the poor in the neighboring city of Guaymas, Mexico.


The Mission's current programs address the many needs of the marginalized population of Guaymas through its free medical/dental clinic, Mesón de Jesus (dining room), food packages for the home-bound and migrant shelter support. In collaboration with Shriners Hospitals, children with orthopedic and burn issues are transported to clinics in Phoenix. Their services are open to all, but they primarily serve four of the poorest Guaymas neighbor-hoods, a population of approximately 10,000 in a city with approximately 110,000 people.

The Mission is current running its annual shoe drive. Each year they discover more children deprived of education because they don't have shoes to attend class. Last year, donations provided shoes for 2,150 children. As a result, they are also seeing more of the children that they serve go on to middle and secondario (a form of high school) schools.

The mission team physically goes out to the camps and neighborhoods measuring feet and accommodating sizes. Although these feet are tinier, in some ways, it reminds me of Christ washing the feet of his beloved disciples. Twenty-five dollars (\$25) provides a pair of new shoes that fit properly.

IDEAS FOR YOUR PARISH TO MARK THE WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY

- Host a Mass of Thanksgiving on the fourth weekend of July with a focus on the celebration of Grandparents. If possible invite Grandparents to be part of the Mass.
- Grandparents' Book of Remembrance: Invite parishioners to share the names of Grandparents
 and elderly members of their family who are no longer with us in a Parish Book of
 Remembrance. The book can be brought to the altar at the start of Mass on the weekend.
- Plant a Tree in your parish in memory of all Grandparents and elders.
- Acknowledge a Grandparent or an elderly person with 'The Grandparents Medal' award from
 the CGA. A commemorative medal is available from the CGA for use for this purpose. As well as
 giving them the commemorative medal for display, you can also present them with a CGA gold
 or silver medal to wear.
- Host a Novena or Holy Hour for Grandparents and the Elderly on the eve of the Sunday.
- Display prayers from the Children's Prayer Appeal in your church on the fourth weekend of July. Make some of these available to local care homes.
- Talk to us about establishing a Grandparents' Ministry in your parish which could be launched to coincide with the World Day of Prayer on the weekend.
- Forget-me-not flowers are the official flowers for Grandparents. These might be included in the liturgy or seeds might be passed on to grandchildren to grow in memory of their Grandparents.
- Send a group to your National Grandparents Pilgrimage. (This year we will have a pilgrimage in Knock, Walsingham, and in Medjugorje.)

Housing Options:

Housing options will include single and double hotel-like rooms with private baths in the, **Christiane Inn** in close proximity to the dining room and meeting rooms. Accommodations are also available in cottages, downhill from the dining and meeting space. **Cottages** have two twin beds per room and shared baths down the hall. Map and more explanation of housing can be found on the regional website.

Event Costs:

All meals (Friday dinner through Sunday breakfast) and registration fees are included in the cost of the rooms. The lodging cost is based on the type of housing selected from the options below. There are no additional fees.

- Inn single room/1 queen bed for 1 person (\$265 by April 30/\$315 after May 1)
- Inn 2nd person in single room/1 queen bed for 2 persons (\$208 per person by April 30/\$235 per person after May 1) must designate roommate
- Inn double room/2 queen beds for 2 persons (\$225 per person by April 30/\$275 per person after May 1) roommate may be designated or assigned (\$200 per person by April 30/\$230 per person
- after May 1) must designate roommates
- Inn double room/2 queen beds for four persons (\$188 per person by April 30/\$210 per person after
- May 1) must designate roommates Cottage two twin beds per room for 2 persons (\$185 per person by April 30/\$235 per person after May 1) roommate may be designated or assigned (no single rooms in cottages)

PLEASE NOTE: Single rooms are limited and available on a 1st come, 1st served basis. If you want a single room, or to reserve any other room of your choice, we encourage you to register and pay the \$150 deposit ASAP.

Payment Options: Payment can be made via check or credit card (subject to 3.5%

fee).
