## Spiritual Assistant's Message August, 2024

In this, the last of my articles on our Franciscan sisters and brothers of other Christian churches around the world, we will take a look at ecumenical and dispersed associations of Franciscan inspiration bot necessarily connected with a mainstream Christian tradition.

The Free Episcopal Church of the USA oversees the Order of Servant Franciscans, whose members are into what they call "the process of becoming" ministers of Christ's message of reconciliation and love as demonstrated in the lives of Francis and Clare.

The Mission Episcopate of Saints Francis and Clare, a self-governing ecclesial authority, oversees the Order of Lesser Sisters and Brothers, open to all male and female Christians, married, single, or partnered, and clergy or lay.

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The Australian Ecumenical Franciscan Order, an independent community, lives an everyday life as seculars. They may follow any Christian tradition and be male or female, married, single, or partnered, clergy, or lay.

The Companions of Jesus is a Franciscan community of reconciliation founded in the United Kingdom in 2004.


The United States Order of Ecumenical Franciscans adopted its Rule on November 22, 1983. This Rule impacted the Order of Lesser Sisters and Brothers described above, making them more dispersed in their community.

The Ecumenical Franciscan Society of Eastern Europe has a mixed membership of Lutherans, Catholics, Orthodox, Anglican and free Protestants.

# Saint of the Day for August – Saint Clare of Assisi

(July 16, 1194 – August 11, 1253)



## Saint Clare of Assisi's Story

One of the more sugary movies made about Francis of Assisi pictures Clare as a golden-haired beauty floating through sun-drenched fields, a sort of one-woman counterpart to the new Franciscan Order.

The beginning of her religious life was indeed movie material. Having refused to marry at 15, Clare was moved by the dynamic preaching of Francis. He became her lifelong friend and spiritual guide.

At 18, Clare escaped from her father's home one night, was met on the road by friars carrying torches, and in the poor little chapel called the Portiuncula received a rough woolen habit, exchanged her jeweled belt for a common rope with knots in it, and sacrificed her long tresses to Francis' scissors. He placed her in a Benedictine convent, which her father and uncles immediately stormed in rage. Clare clung to the altar of the church, threw aside her veil to show her cropped hair, and remained adamant.

Sixteen days later her sister Agnes joined her. Others came. They lived a simple life of great poverty, austerity, and complete seclusion from the world, according to a Rule which Francis gave them as a Second Order. At age 21, Francis obliged Clare under obedience to accept the office of abbess, one she exercised until her death.
