Dear Sisters and Brothers,

In our Franciscan tradition, Advent is an important time on our spiritual journey. Saint Francis instructed his Friars to fast from All Saints Day until Christmas Eve, in preparation for the great celebration of the Incarnation. This was in keeping with the early Christian tradition of fasting before we feast, so that we can really celebrate the feast.

We live in a culture that does not recognize the spiritual value of Advent. People put up Christmas decorations right after Thanksgiving and parties start early in December. By contrast, our church liturgies are focusing on the anticipation of the Messiah and upon those who heralded and awaited his coming, including Isaiah, John the Baptist and Mary, his Mother. So I encourage you once again to stay focused on Advent, which won't be difficult since we pray the Liturgy of the Hours every day.

As you know, the new liturgical year begins with the First Sunday of Advent, which is December 1st this year. As our liturgical year comes to a close during November, let us review the past year and ponder how our Lord has accompanied us and called us to a deeper relationship during this year. If there is anything we need to let go of, this is the time to give it over to our God and be free to begin again. Let our celebration of Thanksgiving be truly that, a time of gratitude for the gift of following Christ in the Franciscan spirit.

While any of us may need to participate in social and secular celebrations of Christmas during December, let's keep our hearts in the spirit of anticipation. Then we will be truly ready to celebrate the Christmas season, which starts with Christmas Eve and extends through the Baptism of the Lord on January 12, 2025. I think it's great that our fraternity's celebration together will occur during this Christmas Season, on the wonderful Feast of the Epiphany on January 5. May Saints Francis and Clare guide us as we prepare our hearts welcome Jesus once again in simplicity and joy!
