
# ENCYCLICAL OF POPE JOHN XXIII ON CHRISTIANITY AND SOCIAL PROGRESS MAY 15, 1961

**Greater Efficiency in Temporal Affairs** 

257. To search for spiritual perfection and eternal salvation in the conduct of human affairs and institutions is not to rob these of the power to achieve their immediate, specific ends, but to enhance this power. The words of our divine Master are true for all time: "Seek ye therefore first the kingdom of God and his justice; and all these things shall be added unto you." (56) The man who is "light in the Lord" (57) and who walks as a "child of the light" (58) has a sure grasp of the fundamental demands of justice in all life's difficulties and complexities, obscured though they may be by so much individual, national and racial selfishness. Animated, too, by the charity of Christ, he finds it impossible not to love his fellow men. He makes his own their needs, their sufferings and their joys. There is a sureness of touch in all his activity in every field. It is energetic, generous and considerate. For "charity is patient, is kind; charity envieth not, dealeth not perversely, is not puffed up, is not ambitious, seeketh not her own, is not provoked to anger, thinketh no evil; rejoiceth not in iniquity, but rejoiceth with the truth; beareth all things, believeth all things, hopeth all things, endureth all things." (59)

restaurants





## <u>The Rule –</u> What we have promised

Chapter Two -The Way of Life

17. In their family they should cultivate the Franciscan spirit of peace, fidelity, and respect for life, striving to make of it a sign of a world already renewed in Christ. By living the grace of matrimony, husbands and wives in particular should bear witness in the world to the love of Christ for his Church. They should joyfully accompany their children on their human and spiritual journey by providing a simple and open Christian education and being attentive to the vocation of each child.

Reflection – Remember Father Peyton's famous statement? "The family that prays together stays together." This is the secret of success for family ministry. Praying together goes beyond just saying prayers together like meal prayers or the rosary or anything else. It is a common opening of one's hearts to God. It is a common striving toward union with God and togetherness with one another. It is taking the risk of sharing with another one's own miseries and joys. It is laying bare before God our brokenness with each other and achieving healing and reconciliation in his presence. It is discovering together the will of the Father through the Word of God and the promptings of the Spirit.

January: The implications of being professed as a Secular Franciscan; and the tradition of the drawing of saints and prayer partners.


February: Servant leadership as a Franciscan defined. March: For Lent, confession based on the Franciscan examination of conscience.
