With all the frightening things occurring in the middle east and strong rumors that we already have troops on the ground, as well as at least two aircraft carriers moving in, it is difficult to remember that we Franciscans live "from Gospel to life and from life to Gospel". But that we do.

-1 Thessalonians tells us to "pray continually" -Proverbs 3 assures that "in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He will make your paths straight.

From "Jesus Calling", my devotional, comes the following:

"I am calling you to a life of constant communion with me. Basic training includes learning to live above your circumstances, even while interacting on that cluttered plane of life. You yearn for a simplified lifestyle, so that your communication with Me can be uninterrupted. But I challenge you to relinquish the fantasy of an uncluttered world. A successful day is one in which you have stayed in touch with Me, even if many things remain undone at the end of the day. Do not let your to-do list become an idol directing your life. The Rule – What we have promised

Chapter Two -The Way of Life

23. Requests for admission to the Secular Franciscan Order must be presented to the local fraternity, whose council decides upon the acceptance of new brothers and sisters.

Admission into the Order is gradually attained through a time of initiation, a period of formation of at least one year, and profession of the rule. The entire community is engaged in this process of growth by its own manner of living. The age for profession and the distinctive Franciscan sign are regulated by the statutes.

Profession by its nature is a permanent commitment.

Members who find themselves in particular difficulties should discuss their problems with the council in fraternal dialogue.

Withdrawal or permanent dismissal from the Order, if necessary, is an act of the fraternity council according to the norm of the constitutions.

Reflection - Paragraph #23 points out the importance of the initial orientation, with elements of both instruction and experience directed toward a life-time commitment in the Order. It also stresses the role of the council in the development of community, especially for new members and for members. A number of important implications develop from this paragraph: It is the responsibility of primarily the council (not just the minister or the spiritual assistant) to lead new members to commitment and exercise charity in particular difficulties. The life of the whole fraternity contributes to the growth of the new members and Furthermore. consolidates it. profession highlighted as a mature and enduring decision to participate as fully as possible in the Church's life and mission according to the manner of Francis.

Pathway to Profession

The process of becoming a Secular Franciscan involves three stages and lasts for a period of 36 months: Orientation, Inquiry, and Candidacy.

These stages represent a journey of discernment and formation, culminating in a lifelong commitment to live the Gospel according to the Rule of the Secular Franciscan Order.
