Minister's Message

What Makes Clare So Special

St. Clare referred to herself, in her rule, as the "little plant" of St. Francis. She is often seen as the feminine reflection of St. Francis' spirit, embodying a love for God and all creation, a deep devotion to Christ's humanity and passion, humility, detachment, simplicity, and a genuine enthusiasm for life. These attributes did not diminish her humanity but, instead, enriched it.

Clare's dedication to poverty was unwavering. She succeeded in convincing three of the century's greatest popes to honor her commitment. When Pope Gregory IX offered to release her from her vow of absolute poverty, she responded, "Holy Father, absolve me from my sins but not from the obligation of following our Lord."

St. Clare is recognized as the patron saint of many causes and professions, including eye disease, goldsmiths, laundry, television, bicycle messengers, good weather, needleworkers. remote viewing, and extrasensory perception.

It is a great honor that our founding Franciscans chose Clare as the namesake of our Fraternity. Her life and virtues serve as a guiding example for us all

Formation, Formation, FORMATION!!!

ST. CLARE OF ASSISI

St. Clare is a spectacular saint in our Catholic Church and the patroness of our St Clare Fraternity. Her feast day is August 11th. St Clare's unwavering commitment to her faith, her radical renunciation of material wealth, and her influential leadership in fostering spiritual growth, still inspires people around the world. She founded the Poor Clare Nuns, an order of women who are discalced (wearing only sandals, year-round) and cloistered (living within a closed convent and focusing on contemplative prayer, day and night, and continuous fasting from all but the minimal intake of food). Clare considered silence a means of avoiding the tumultuousness of life and of committing any sins of the tongue, so, even now, the Poor Clares do not speak, except at prayer and by special permission. Chiara or Clare, was born into the royalty of Assisi on July 16, 1194, and became a lifelong follower of St Francis. She was expected to marry into wealth to enhance her family's standing, but chose, instead, a very different path. After hearing the preaching of St Francis, so touched was she that she fled from her home and secretly met with Francis at the Portiuncula Chapel, where Francis cut her beautiful long hair and dressed her in a rough penitential habit of drab color. Thus, she renounced any possible leaning toward any life but that of holy virginity and temperance. Together with St Francis, she founded the Order of Poor Clares which still exists today. Many years after Clare founded the Poor Clares, her two biological sisters and her widowed Mother also professed to her order of nuns. Mother Angelica was a Poor Clare, living a modern version of taming the innumerable sins of the tongue and focusing only on God, with her ministry of technical communication; the ETWN television and radio network. Clare is best known for her defense of her convent from invaders by carrying the Blessed Sacrament to the door, when death was imminent. She did this at least twice with the enemy quietly turning away. One especially notable event was her bringing a Monstrance containing the Eucharist to the door and raising it high, when the Saracens threatened to kill all of the nuns. St Clare is the patron saint of television, because when she became too ill to attend Mass, she saw the entire Mass projected on her bedroom wall! Clare died on August 11, 1253 and was canonized two years later by Pope Alexander IV.

Get ready to welcome Jane Kurz, RN PhD to our gathering this month. She will be sharing with us a new program she runs for unhoused people who visit the Community Resource Center in Rehoboth Beach. Jane offers blood pressure checks in a private setting and discussions about other obvious medical issues. She is not allowed to dispense any medicine, not even aspirin, so she gives advice and offers small denomination gift cards to stores that sell salve's, Tylenol, ace type bandages, and other health related sundries. Also \$4 bus passes so the people can access these stores. Jane can and does refer people with bigger issues to specialists at Beebe, La Red Health Ctr. etc., who provide indepth care, without charge. Jane is sponsored by "Nurses & Neighbors", a non-profit composed of mostly retired medical personnel.

We can support Jane in this compassionate service to the vulnerable by helping stock her "medical bag" with the following:

The Rule -What we have promised

Chapter Two -The Way of Life

25. Regarding expenses necessary for the life of the fraternity and the needs of worship, of the apostolate, and of charity, all the brothers and sisters should offer a contribution according to their means. Local fraternities should contribute toward the expenses of the higher fraternity councils.

Reflection – This paragraph points out that the voluntary contributions of the members finance the fraternity's spiritual and temporal needs and activities. The fraternity, according to its means and agreed-upon arrangements, also contributes to the support of the regional, provincial, national, and international fraternities. This paragraph is a contemporary application of the traditional Secular Franciscan values outlined in the very first rule that the members are responsible for taking care of their own in whatever way is necessary.


