

Last week I viewed the new St Maximillian Kolbe film <u>,Triumph of the Heart</u>. It is a beautiful testament to what it means to be a companion in Christ. If you have time, I recommend watching it.

We are not alone in our journey. We have the accompaniment of our family, friends, and our Franciscan brothers and sisters. There are the Poor Clares offering the intentions of the world for us behind the walls of the convent. There are the friars who care for the holy relics in the Holy Land while war rages. There are the prayers of the faithful who pray for all those who cannot pray for themselves.

The men in the cell in Auschwitz were not alone. There were many outside the walls praying for the men inside.

The man that was saved that day in Auschwitz, Franciszek Gajowniczek, shared Saint Maximillian's story of sacrifice, and ultimately attended Kolbe's beatification. Without Gajowniczek, Kolbe's story may have been swept into the ashes of Auschwitz. The songs, and prayers emanating from the cell changed everyone who heard, and everyone who will hear.

This month we pray for all those who have gone before us in the Holy Saints and the Holy Souls. Their prayers are accompanying us today. We are never alone.
